


First of all: who we are?



- 1 Milion hectares of forest (36% of the region area)
- 1/3 public and 2/3 private
- 72% mountains
- 18% hills
- 10% plains
- 1.000 forestry companies (including 550 in the Regional Register)
- 2.500 forestry operators

Profession

By what means?

Community funds

- RDP 2006-2006: 2,8 million euro
- RDP 2007-2014: 8,0 million euro
- RDP 2014-2020: 7,3 million euro
- Cross-Border cooperation
 (Interreg ITA-FRA): 1 million euro

Regional funds

• 1 million euro until 2009

20 million euro in 20 years! 95% EU funds





Results in Piedmont

- 2.500 users involved (average 2.7 courses for user)
- 6.755 professional skills certifications
- 506 professional qualifications
- widespread awareness that training is a strategic factor for competitiveness and development
- qualification as a tool to know each others, collaborate, make system

Italian forest context

• 11 million hectares of forest

(36,5% surface)

34% pubblic66% private

• 6.471 forestry companies

• 12.166 operators

Yet Italy is among the main wood importers in the world.

80% of its needs come from abroad.





Forestry training in Italy

The national educational cycle (compulsory school - state competence) **doesn't** include professional forestry courses.


Regions have exclusive legislative power on professional training: each Region has its own law and can operate independently!

Northern regions promote courses **for adults** to increase the professionalism and safety of employees and to qualify companies (Legislative Decree 227/2001), generating a **plurality of training systems** not always interconnected

The Legislative Decree 34/2018 provides that

Regions promote operators training and professional development

 By MIPAAF decree are defined the national minimum criteria for vocational training of forestry operators and for for the execution of the interventions





Draft Ministerial Decree on training

National minimum criteria are identified:

a) by skills and / or qualifications contained in the "National Directory of Education and Training Titles and Professional Qualifications"

b) by forestry training courses codified by Regions for which are defined correspondence with UNI 11660 standard profiles

- Atlante e professioni che raccoglie le Professioni regolamentate (Direttiva 2005/36/CE e successive integrazioni), il Repertorio delle professioni dell'apprendistato (costituito da tutti i profili presenti nei Contratti Collettivi Nazionali di Lavoro relativi all'apprendistato professionalizzante), le Associazioni professionali (L. n.4/2013) che riuniscono le professioni non organizzate in ordini o collegi.
- Atlante e qualificazioni che raccoglie in una stessa cornice le qualificazioni rilasciate nei diversi ambiti del sistema di apprendimento permanente: Scuola, Istruzione e Formazione Professionale, Formazione superiore e Formazione professionale regionale.

UNI 11660:2016 standard


Unregulated professional activities - Forestry operator - Knowledge, skill and competence requirements

- technical standard consistent with the vocational training framework
- common language for all, facilitates the mutual recognition of the operators skills between the Regions
- provides 4 professional profiles, described for knowledge, skills and competences:
 - 1) forestry **operator**
 - 2) **specialized** forestry operator
 - 3) forestry cable crane driver
 - 4) specialized **operating machines** driver



Ministerial Decree support measures

- 1. Define the **national standard** of the forestry instructor to have similar quality levels respecting the regional autonomy
- 2. **Communicate** on the territory the contents of the Ministerial Decree and the importance of training and safety
- 3. Do **training courses** for forestry instructors, especially in areas that do not have this professional figure (mainly in central and southern Italy)

(Forest Training for Italy)


Reproposing best Regional initiatives at national level for:



National Standard Forestry Instructor

- From tested and positive experience of some Regions, has been developed a proposal of:
 - Professional profile
 - Standard of delivery and certification
 - Course program
- The proposal has been technically validated by all Regions and the process for its official approval has been started





Professional profile

- Name: Forest Instructor on felling and processing
- Description: specialized operator with skills in forestry use and teaching methods
- EQF level: 4
- Activity areas: felling and processing in forestry site; hooking up and ground-skidding; educational provision activity





Next steps

- 1. **Partnership definition** (Leader + partner) February 2020
- 2. **Definitive planning** and approval April 2020
- 3. Launch event May 2020
- 4. National Standard Forestry Instructor approval Summer 2020
- 5. Project **financing** Summer 2020
- 6. Project **start** Autumn 2020
